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# Filmmaker Dr. Shakti Butler to Speak at Cerro Coso

Cerro Coso Community College invites the community to an evening with educator, filmmaker, speaker, social justice activist, and healer Dr. Shakti Butler and her work "Cracking the Codes: The System of Racial Inequity" on Thursday, February 6, 2014 at 7 p.m. in the College Lecture Center.

Dr. Butler is a multiracial African-American woman (African, Arawak Indian, and Russian-Jewish) whose work as a creative and visionary bridge builder has challenged and inspired learning for over two decades.

She is the producer and director of the groundbreaking documentaries, "The Way Home," "Light in the Shadows," and "Mirrors of Privilege: Making Whiteness Visible." Her newest film, "Cracking the Codes: The System of Racial Inequity" examines the causes and consequences of systemic inequity in the United States and features some two dozen racial justice leaders from across the country.

In 1994, as Executive Director of World Trust Educational Services, Dr. Butler designed and launched HEART-TO-HEART CONVERSATIONS, a national program

of public dialogue designed to help people to learn together and share deep feelings about race and culture. This program has gained recognition and has been reviewed by both local and national television.

A warm and compassionate person, Dr. Butler uses her ability to listen deeply while asking critical questions that support self-directed learning in others. Her speaking and teaching styles enrich people's ability to move toward expanded capacities for building community. Her videos and conversation programs stimulate the kind of new questions, which enhance any efforts toward deep learning and change.

Dr. Butler received her doctorate from the California Institute of Integral Studies in the School of Transformative Learning and Change. She holds an MA in Guidance and Counseling from Bank Street College of New York and graduated magna cum laude from City College of New York.

A screening of Dr. Butler's film Cracking the Codes will be held on Wednesday, February 5, 2014 from 6 – 7:30 p.m. followed by the lecture on Thursday, February 6, 2014 from 7 to 9 p.m. Both activities will be held in the College Lecture Center.

Cerro Coso Community College will celebrate veterans during the month of November with activities dedicated to honoring those who served our country. A variety of activities, films, and exhibits are planned for the Ridgecrest campus and local community to celebrate veterans and service members.

To kick off Veterans month, Cerro Coso hosted a community screening of the movie *The Hurt Locker* followed by a question and answer session. In the 2008 American war film during the Iraq War, a Sergeant recently assigned to an army bomb squad is put at odds with his squad mates due to his maverick way of handling his work.



An educational veteran book exhibit is on display in the College Library and veterans, students, and faculty are encouraged to display veteran pictures and share stories. Poster boards will be on display in the College and Ridgecrest Library's to encourage veterans, families, and friends to share their responses to specific prompts.

On Wednesday, November 19<sup>th</sup> the college will host a free community screening in the College Student Center at 6:30 p.m. of *Ground Operations*, a documentary and social campaign that champions the growing network of combat veterans who are transitioning into careers as sustainable farmers, ranchers, and artisan food producers.
