## Hello faculty,

SARS Early Alert is a tool you can use to reach out to students struggling in your classes. Students who receive an Early Alert from their instructor also receive follow-up from the counseling office regarding college resources and services. Students are also reminded of the drop dates, and are invited to assess their progress prior to these dates so that a substandard grade can be avoided in as many cases as possible. This form can also be used as a referral for tutoring by following the instructions below.

\*\*Please note, it is difficult to provide meaningful follow-up services to students if there is not specific information regarding the nature of your concerns. The more specific you are in the message to the student, the more effective I can be in providing resources.

Keep in mind that the message you type is intended for the student. Please address the student in your message rather than me.

I have attached the instructions on how to use the SARS Early Alert system. The system will be available for use as of Monday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>. As always, if you have any questions about the process or the follow-up, please feel free to contact me!

- 1. Go to your class roster via InsideCC
- 2. Click "Go to the Early Alert System" (this link is right above the link, "Download class list to Excel worksheet")
- 3. Read the welcome page, then click "Continue"
- 4. Enter the student's ID number, OR under "Instructor/Course Information" use the drop down menu next to "Course Number," and then select the class for which you're sending an alert. (An error box often pops up here; select OK.) Your class roster will pop up in a new window.
- 5. Select the student to whom you want to send an alert. Then click "OK." SELECT ONE STUDENT AT A TIME. If you select multiple students at a time, they will all receive the same message, which is not the purpose of Early Alert.
- 6. Select the Academic Concerns you have for the student
- 7. Select the Services you recommend for the student
- 8. Write an individualized message to the student. \*\*\*If you are using this as a tutor referral form, you must specify the skills you want the student to work on in tutoring
- 9. Click "Submit"

If SARS Alert is not functioning properly for you and you have a student who needs support, please email detailed information (Student name, ID, nature of concern, recommended services) to me at <a href="mailto:mgross@cerrocoso.edu">mgross@cerrocoso.edu</a>.
