- 4F1B The District shall maintain an organized program for men and women in intercollegiate athletics. The program shall not discriminate on the basis of gender in the availability of athletic opportunities.
- <u>Associated Student Bodies</u> The associated student bodies of the Colleges are recognized as advisory bodies to the Board of Trustees and are subject to the control and regulation of the Board of Trustees. Advisors to student governments shall be selected on each campus in accordance with criteria and procedures established by each campus.
  - 4F2A The Colleges shall establish procedures to ensure students the opportunity to express their opinions and to ensure that these opinions are given every reasonable consideration and the right to participate effectively in District and College governance.
  - 4F2B The associated student bodies may engage in any activities, including fundraising activities which have been approved by the College President or designee. No hazing activities as defined by the California Education Code §32050 may be practiced by any organization or its members.
  - 4F2C The associated students shall conduct annual elections to elect officers. The elections shall be conducted in accordance with procedures established by the College. (Education Code Section 76061) Any student elected as an officer in the associated students shall meet both of the following requirements:
    - The student shall be enrolled in the district at the time of election and throughout his/her term of office, with a minimum of five semester units or the equivalent
    - 2. The student shall meet and maintain the minimum standards of scholarship.
- Clubs and Organizations Clubs and organizations will be organized in conformity with procedures established by each College. Clubs will be supervised by an advisor. Clubs shall establish aims which are educational and compatible with College and/or community interest. Exploitation of the name of the College or District shall not be permitted. There shall be no secret fraternities, sororities, or clubs.
- Student Political Club Activity Any student political club which is affiliated with the official youth division of any political party that is on the ballot of the State of California may hold meetings on a community college campus and may distribute bulletins and circulars concerning its meetings, provided that there is no endorsement of such organization by College authorities and no interference with the regular education program of the College.
