# Advising High School Seniors 2018

- Bring your catalog and multiple measures guides.
- Remind students of completing online orientation - if not already completed the online version or had a one-hour in-person orientation. The pre-orientation (half-hour) did not count as full orientation.
- Promote the use of Navigate for all students. Explain the use of the Major Explorer, the ability for them to set up a schedule, get reminders on dates, etc. Bring the Navigate postcards.
- Let them know that they are getting an abbreviated plan but need to schedule a time for an LTEP. Encourage students to come in at least once per semester to meet with a counselor or advisor.
- FOR IWV only –
  - Please promote the combination of COUN C101 and LIBR C100. The classes are offered at the same time on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We scheduled them so that they complement each other as a Tues/Thurs on-ground class pairing. Obviously, these are excellent foundation classes for high school seniors to kick off their college career.
  - We will be offering COUN C101 on-ground over the summer as part of a bridge program.
- LIBR C100 will have no prerequisites starting this fall.
- Promote students to have a goal of completing 30 units within a year. This can be a combination of 15 units a semester or using summer to reduce fall/spring load. Full-time students are generally more successful, so we are pushing when we can for students to take more units. Of course, this is not always appropriate so use your judgement and keep in mind the other obligations students have. However, the use of the Promise program can help students to achieve this financially.
- Please promote the Promise program and Umoja program, when appropriate. There is information about both programs on the website.
- English and Math –
  - Promote students to take English and math in their first term.
  - At IWV, in the fall, we will be piloting the ENGL C070S (co-requisite instruction) for students who place below ENGL C070. Math will follow in the spring. For students taking on-ground classes at IWV, it may benefit them to wait until spring for the math co-requisite to roll-out. However, they should definitely start with English in fall.
  - All other sites are operating as-is on math and English until the co-requisites roll-out at their sites and online.
  - If a student has taken an AP class and plans to take the exam, we need to wait for their scores in order to clear for the appropriate class. Schedule them for a full-time load with alternative classes in the meantime. They can come back and change their classes once they have their scores.
- Promote the use of Writing and Math labs, tutoring, Access programs, and other resources.

## Orientation and Assessment at Burroughs High School

- See your high school counselor to sign up for the assessment test at BHS:
  - Tuesday, Feb. 20th 3:00pm
  - Thursday, Feb. 22nd 3:00pm
  - Monday, Feb. 26th 3:00pm

If you cannot make any of these dates, you may take the assessment test at the **Cerro Coso Community College Campus**. Please call to schedule your appointment **760-384-6219** (be sure to tell them you are a high school student).

You are strongly urged to study for the Accuplacer Placement Exam. This test can be taken one time within a 3-year period, therefore we encourage students to do their best on this test. It is important to get the highest score possible, not only because it cannot be retaken, but also because it could possibly save hundreds of dollars on the cost of books and tuition if a student were able to test into higher levels of English and Math classes. ## Counseling at Burroughs High School

- Counseling Sessions: Counselors and advisors will be on your high school campus following the completion of the assessment test to help advise you of which classes to take. Sign up for your counseling session with a Cerro Coso counselor at the high school counseling department. If you miss this counseling appointment, you will need to make an appointment for counseling at the Cerro Coso campus at **760-384-6219**.

## Registration

- Priority Registration begins April 4th, 2018

Beginning April 10th each high school student who has completed orientation, assessment test, and counseling will receive priority registration.

## Payment

- You can defer your Fall 2018 fees. The system will drop you from your classes if you do not pay your registration fees within 10 days of registering. You can defer payment until August 1, 2018. If you choose to defer payment you **must** contact the Cerro Coso Financial Aid Department to complete the "Repayment of Enrollment Fees" form at **760-384-6221** and let them know that you are a high school student and that you will be deferring payment. **If you do not contact them or pay your fees, you will be dropped from your classes 10 days after you register.**

# How to Register

- Priority Registration for high school students will begin on **April 11-16, 2018**.  
Beginning in April each student who has completed the college assessments, orientation, and counseling will be granted priority registration through insideCC.
- Registration can be completed on campus at the Admissions and Records Office or online. If you choose to register online please go to <https://inside.cerrocoso.edu/> and login using your Cerro Coso assigned email address ([first.lastname1234@email.cerrocoso.edu](mailto:first.lastname1234@email.cerrocoso.edu)) and password. Once logged in click on **MyBanWeb** in the upper left. Next click on **Add or Drop Classes**. Select the term that you are registering for then click **Submit**. You will be brought to the registration page, scroll to the bottom to the boxes and enter in the CRN (course reference number) on the schedule sheet that the Cerro Coso advisor/counselor gave to you. Once all CRN's are entered click on the **Submit Changes** button. If everything is correct, you will want to select "Complete Registration."
- You can defer payment. After registering the system will drop students from their classes if they do not pay their registration fees within 10 days of registering. You can defer payment until **August 1, 2018** (for fall courses only). If you choose to defer payment, contact the Cerro Coso Financial Aid Dept. to complete the "Repayment of Enrollment Fees" form at 384-6221 and let them know that you are a high school student and that you will be deferring payment. If you do not contact them or you do not pay your fees you will be dropped from your classes 10 days after you register.

# Enrollment

- Open enrollment
- Access to education for everyone
- 18 years of age, a high school graduate, or GED
- AB540
  - Any student who has attended a California high school for 3 years and graduates from a California high school can be considered a resident and pay resident tuition.



# Admissions and Registration

- Ongoing Admissions
  - Applications are accepted at any time.
  - Registration continues through the first day of class.
- Priority Registration
  - Beginning the process early gives you priority registration and greater access to classes.
  - High School Seniors are given priority if they have completed:
    - ✓ Orientation
    - ✓ Assessment
    - ✓ Counseling/Abbreviated Education Plan
  - For high school seniors only, April 4<sup>th</sup> is priority registration for the 2018 Summer and Fall semesters.

# Why Core Services?

- Students who complete all of the core services (orientation, assessment, counseling, and a long-term education plan) are more likely to be successful in their classes!
- Why?
  - Placed in courses that match interests and goals, support from a counselor, and better prepared to succeed.
  - Students who have completed **all** of the core components will receive a registration date within the priority registration period.
- Core Components for Priority Registration are:
  - Orientation, Assessment, Counseling, Student Education Plan

# Assessment

Required to register for English and math

- The placement exam is NOT pass or fail. The exam is designed to place a student in classes in which they are most likely to be successful.
- Students can only take the placement exam one time. Students should prepare for the placement exam by going to <http://www.collegeboard.com/student/testing/accuplacer/> and review math skills through Khan Academy [www.khanacademy.org](http://www.khanacademy.org)
- High school transcripts can be reviewed for English and math placement.
- State Testing such as CASSP and SBAC can be reviewed for English and math.
- Orientation and the placement exam are available throughout each semester.
- Multiple measures are used to maximize student placement and success.

# Assessment at the High Schools

- Assessment offered at some high school campuses.
- High school students must sign up with their high school counselor.
- Burroughs High School
- Trona High School
- Mesquite High School
- If you attend a high school that is not listed, please contact Cerro Coso Community College to schedule an appointment (760) 384-6219.

# Counseling and Course Scheduling at the High Schools

- After assessment and orientation, Cerro Coso counseling staff will come to the high school campuses and assist students with course selection based on their placement exam scores and educational goals.
- Priority Registration begins April 4<sup>th</sup>
- Students may defer payment for the upcoming fall semester until August 1st. If you want to defer payment you must complete the “Repayment of Enrollment Fees” form and call the Financial Aid Office at (760) 384-6221.

# Concurrent Enrollment

Beginning in ninth grade, students can earn college credit at Cerro Coso while concurrently enrolled in high school.

- Requires approval of a school official from the high school (e.g. guidance counselor).
- A high school transcript or placement exam are required for enrollment in an English or math class.
- Not all college classes may be approved for high school students. There may be GPA and unit limits.
- Students should start with introductory courses. PDEV Co52 recommended for first time online students.
- Important for students to understand the responsibilities of taking college classes (e.g. attendance, assignments, independent performance). Purchasing textbooks is the student's responsibility.
- Concurrent enrollment forms can be obtained in the high school counseling office, the Cerro Coso counseling office, or online.

# Degrees and Certificates

- Cerro Coso offers two-year degrees:
  - Associate of Arts (AA)- General degrees are designed to prepare students for transfer to a four-year school.
  - Associate of Science (AS)- Vocational degrees designed to prepare students for immediate employment in a particular career field.
  - Associate of Arts/Science for Transfer (AA-T/AS-T) – degrees that streamline the process of transferring to a CSU campus in a similar program.
- To earn an Associate Degree you must:
  - Complete 60 degree applicable units
  - Complete general education requirements and major requirements.
  - Have at minimum a cumulative 2.0 GPA
- Short-term certificates can be earned in most Associate of Science subject areas.

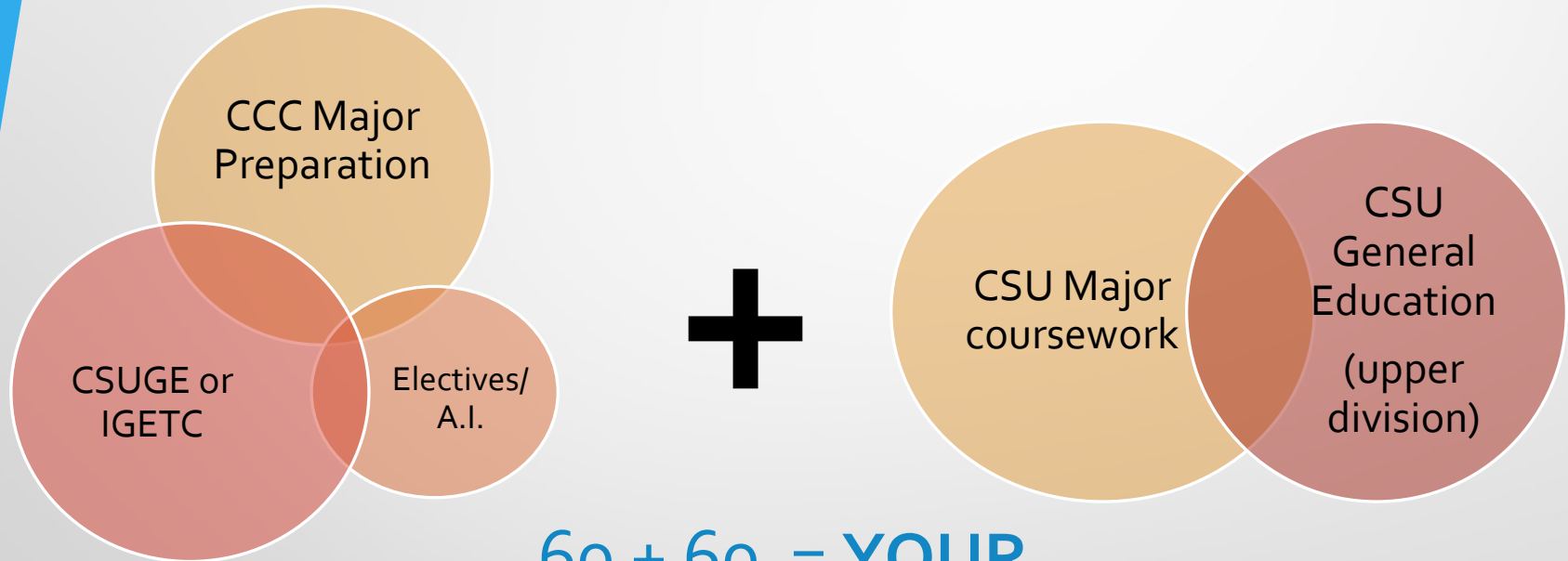



# Inscripción Simultanea

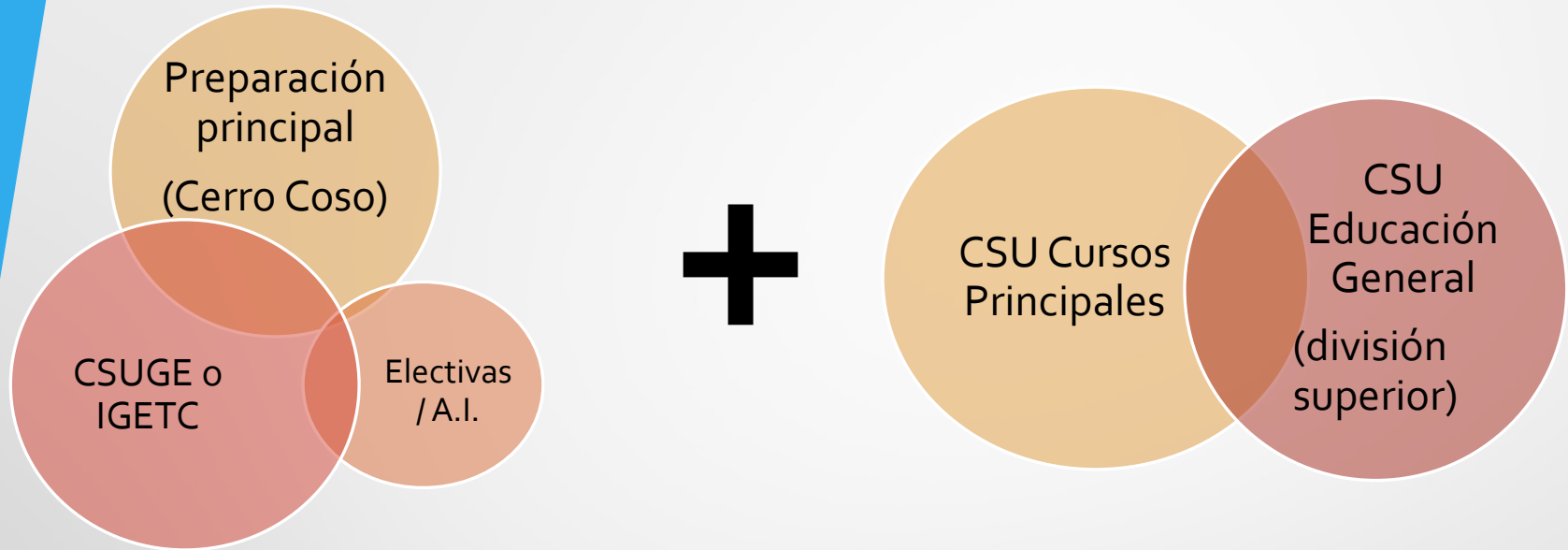


