INDIAN WELLS VALLEY CAMPUS

The original Cerro Coso Campus, the 320-acre Indian Wells Valley Campus, is located in the upper Mojave Desert in the community of Ridgecrest, with a population of 28,000. Ridgecrest is located 130 miles northeast of Los Angeles and 120 miles east of Bakersfield. The Indian Wells Valley campus features a new state-of-the-art Learning Resource Center and computer facility. Also new to the IWV campus is a solar photovolatic field that serves the main building, saving the college hundreds of thousands of dollars a year in electricty costs. Ridgecrest is expected to grow by several thousand residents over the next several years due to national military base realignment. The local military base, the Naval Air Warfare Center Weapons Division is a major economic entity in the community of Ridgecrest.

CC ONLINE

CC Online, Cerro Coso Community College's virtual campus, currently offers nine Associate degrees online, the general education courses necessary to meet transfer requirements to a four year institution, and student support services. CC Online has an international reputation for excellence and provides an extraordinary opportunity for those too distant from a community college or too involved in business or family to pursue higher education during traditional hours. In addition to online classes Cerro Coso now offers numerous Interactive Television (iTV) courses, many of which can be accessed from any of our campus centers. iTV allows students from all of our campuses to attend a single class simultaneously in state-ofthe-art facilities.

KERN RIVER VALLEY CAMPUS

The Kern River Valley Campus serves the communities of the Kern River Valley from its campus at the Kern Valley Plaza in Lake Isabella. Students in Lake Isabella, Wofford Heights, Kernville, Mt. Mesa, South Lake, and Onyx can find easy access to the campus via public and private

transportation. The campus offers both day and evening classes. Kern River Valley Campus offers testing, counseling, advisement, and financial aid assistance, which enables students to meet their educational goals.

EASTERN SIERRA COLLEGE CENTER





PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Child Development Program is designed for students interested in infant, toddler, preschool or schoolage education. Students may earn an A.S. degree in Child Development or an Assistant Teacher Award, Associate Teacher Award or Teacher Certificate for completing a defined course of study that requires fewer units than the A.S. degree. The California Child Development Permit Matrix requirements are reflected in our program allowing students to qualify for the permits required for teaching in programs governed by Title V and funded by contracts with the State of California. Permits are issued by the State Department of Education, California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (not Cerro Coso) and include Assistant Teacher, Associate Teacher, Teacher, Master Teacher, and Site Supervisor.

All professionals working with children are required to have a clean criminal record, to demonstrate freedom from tuberculosis (TB), and to demonstrate the physical ability to perform all of the duties of a professional position working directly with children.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNOLOGY

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

To be eligible to work in pre-hospital emergency care individuals must become certified as an Emergency Medical Technician - Basic. The EMT-B works with paramedics, law enforcement officers, fire fighters, air medical crewmembers, and even bystanders to provide care and transportation of sick or injured patients. The care is continued throughout transport to an appropriate medical facility where care is transferred to the nurses and physicians. The EMT course is a one semester course that provides training in the recognition, assessment, treatment, and practical techniques for pre-hospital emergency medical care of patient(s). Students are trained using the national standards and become eligible to complete the state approved testing after completion of this course. Although it is only a one semester course the lecture, practical application and clinical experience require class participation and appropriate study time to be prepared to become an EMT-Basic.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Human Services Program prepares students for employment in a broad range of human services settings. It consists of seven core courses and offers additional specialized courses to develop competencies for specific employment settings. Although individual courses are offered online, the full certificate is currently not available in online environments. The A.S. degree requires 60 units total, 26 in the major, in additional to general education requirements and electives.

The Human Services field is very broad covering mental health, substance recovery, families support, domestic violence, child and elderly neglect and abuse, the exceptional child, and the homeless. It is a career concerned with meeting human needs and improving the overall quality of people's lives.

Human Services professionals assist other professionals from a wide variety of fields, from psychology to rehabilitation. They provide client services and support for families. Among the services provided by Human Services professionals may be helping clients identify benefits or social and community services available to them. They also assist social workers in a variety of ways helping to build human and family relationships, address substance abuse situations, and provide rehabilitation or adult day care services. With such a wide range of opportunities available, a Human Services professional has a world of opportunities available to them.



Vocational Nursing is an intensive program approved by the California Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians. The Program's hours include anatomy and physiology, psychology, nursing theory, and supervised clinical nursing experiences.

Concepts of the fundamentals of nursing, geriatrics, nutrition, and pharmacology are integrated in the first semester of the Program. Nursing care of clients with varied adult medical-surgical conditions is integrated throughout the three semesters of the program.

Course content also includes concepts of normal obstetrics and pediatrics. After successful completion of the program, the student is eligible to take the licensure examination provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCLEX-PN).



This course provides an examination of the underlying theoretical principles of developmentally appropriate practices applied to programs and environments. Students may be required to observe children in a group setting.

CHDV C102 Materials and Curriculum

This course is designed as an overview of the various approaches to curriculum development and implementation. Developmentally Appropriate Practices (DAP) will provide a basis for exploring a variety of curriculum theories and models such as High/Scope, Reggio Emilia, and Montessori. Students will be designing, implementing, and evaluating activities with young children.

CHDV C104 Child, Family, and Community

This course examines patterns of family systems in contemporary society as influenced by heritage, diverse cultures, abilities, and languages. The value of communication, the development of child advocacy skills, and the ability to use community resources to empower families and children are explored.

CHDV C106 Child Growth and Development

This course will examine the physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional growth and developmen of children from the prenatal period through adolescence. Emphasis is placed on children as individuals and their needs in the modern world.

This course introduces positive and effective approaches for guiding children's behavior in the classroom and family settings.

This course will discuss health and safety issues

CHDV C121 Health, Safety, and Nutrition

in early childhood education and family day care settings. Topics include pediatric first aid and CPR, preventative health practices, control of infectious disease, injury prevention, nutrition. sanitation, emergency preparedness, child abuse and children with special needs.

CHDV C125 Diversity in Education

This course leads the student through a process of exposing societal contradictions in the areas of race, gender, ethnicity, culture, etc. The student will identify biases, transform to an understanding of self and society, and recognize an anti-bias approach as a new beginning.

CHDV C200 Observation and Assessment

This course focuses on the appropriate use of assessment and observation strategies to document development, growth, plan and learning to join with families and professionals in promoting children's success. Recording strategies, rating systems, portfolios, and multiple assessment tools are explored.

CHDV C203 Practicum: Field Experience

A demonstration of developmentally appropriate teaching competencies under guided supervision, students work in a supervised field experience for at least 54 hours in an instructor approved infant/toddler. preschool, or school-age program,*

CHDV C111 Principles of Child Guidance CHDV C145 Language and Literature

This course develops the skills of storytelling and story reading for all ages. Special emphasis will be on incorporating reading and writing activities into an emergent literacy program that supports children's language development through the use of children's literature.

CHDV C149 Play and Meaning

Elective Courses

This course delves into the intricacies of play in the classroom and how children use play to develop meaning. Special emphasis will be placed on building play into the curriculum for children aged birth to school-age.

CHDV C281 Adult Supervision

The course addresses adult supervision and leadership in the Child Development profession. The course will provide background on leadership and the roles leaders assume using principles from business applied specifically to the business of childcare and development. The course will provide step-by-step information and ideas for an effective supervisory program with special attention to staff orientation. Finally, the course will explore the leader's role as change agent and professional.

Infant Specialization

Specializations

CHDV C105 Introduction to Infant Development

This course introduces the process of human development from conception to age two with an emphasis on embryonic, fetal, neonatal, infant, and toddler stages.

CHDV C205 Foundations of Infant Development

This course will include a study of growth and development from conception to age 2 through an understanding of biology and environment on development. Emphasis will be placed on the appreciation of the interrelatedness of theory, research, and applications. This course will include research and evidence from field experience with children in a wide variety of environments

School-Age Specialization

CHDV C107 School-Age Development

This course provides information on schoolage developmental needs and stages, techniques for interacting positively and effectively with children, and ideas to assist in meeting the wide range of children's needs. The design of schedules, policies, the environment, and activities are based upon the understanding of children's development, special needs, and cultural background.

CHDV C207 School-Age Curriculum

This course provides information on how to implement quality programs for school-age children. Students will learn assessment, planning, implementation, and evaluation of programs. Standards for quality school-age care will be used to assess quality indicators in the areas of human relationships, indoor and outdoor environments, activities, health, nutrition, safety, and administration.

Children with Exceptional Needs Specialization CHDV C125 Diversity in Education

This course leads the student through a process of exposing societal contradictions in the areas of race, gender, ethnicity, culture, etc. The student will identify biases, transform to an understanding of self and society, and recognize an anti-bias approach as a new beginning.

CHDV C241 Exceptional Child: Nature & Needs

Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC)

The Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) is a program funded by the California Department of Education, Child Development Division (CDE/CDD) with Federal Block Grant Child Care and Development Quality Improvement Funds. The program was created to address the critical shortage of qualified childcare workers in the state of California. The CDTC provides the following program services:

- 1. Community College Reimbursement **Program:** Reimbursement for specific educational expenses available through Cerro Coso Community College.
- 2. Child Development Permits: The CDTC has two sources of funding, CDE/CDD and First 5 California, to pay application and fingerprint (Live Scan) processing fees for Child Development Permit applicants.
- 3. Professional Growth Advisor Project: The CDTC provides professional growth advisor trainings and support through Cerro Coso Community College.

Program Description

The Child Development program is designed for students interested in infant, toddler, preschool or school-age education. The program provides a broad base of knowledge related to the physical, mental, emotional, and social aspects of growth and development, as well as the care and auidance of children. It focuses on promoting understanding of the scientific study of children within the family, culture, peer group, school, and neighborhood contexts which influence their development.

The California Child Development Permit Matrix is reflected in our program allowing students to receive the permits required for teaching in Children's Centers and Compensatory Education Preschool Programs, which are financed by state funds. Cerro Coso issues the A.S. Degree and Teacher Certificate while all levels of the Permit Matrix are issued by the State Department of Education, California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

Degrees & Certificates

The Associate of Science degree in Child Development qualifies students, who also have completed the experience requirement, to apply for the Teacher and/or Master Teacher Permit. This allows a student to enter the workforce at the Teacher or Master Teacher level.


