Concurrent Enrollment in College

Concurrent enrollment in college courses by high school students is a privilege provided by Cerro Coso Community College. This process applies to ALL students who are under the age of 18 and have not graduated from high school or completed high school equivalency. In order for a student to be placed in course work in a quick and effective manner, it is important to follow the process outlined below.

Please read the following information carefully:

1. Submit College Application

- New students: Apply online at www.cerrocoso.edu/myBanWeb
- Continuing students: Fill out an Update form at www.cerrocoso.edu/myBanWeb
- Applications/Updates also available at the Admissions and Records Office

2. Complete Concurrent Enrollment Form

Counselors (at all schools) have the concurrent enrollment forms for students and parents.

- A. Student/Parent Section: Parent and student must complete all of the information requested on the Student/Parent section of the Concurrent Enrollment Form. The parent or guardian must sign this form if the student is under the age of 18 years old and BEFORE the student will be allowed to register for courses. NOTE: if the college class is to be used for HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT, be sure the student signs on the line provided.
- **B. School Official Section:** Student meets with a high school counselor to review student record. If high school record indicates the desired course work is appropriate, high school counselor completes and signs the School Official Section.
- 1. Number of School Credits: The student must have earned enough credits to qualify for freshman class standing or qualify for the Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) Program. GATE verification forms can be obtained at the School District Office and must be submitted with the Concurrent Enrollment Form.
- 2. Grade Point Average: If a student wishes to enroll in a college class he or she must have achieved a cumulative GPA of 2.75.
 - 3. Credit: One of these boxes must be checked.
 The school official must indicate whether
 the course will be taken for high school
 credit, college credit, or both.
 - 4. Course Name: The complete title and number of the course should be entered here. Also indicate whether each course is to be taken for college or high school credit.

- 5. Initials of School Official: Please individually initial each course being approved. The Cerro Coso counselor will consider only courses initialed.
- 6. Release Approval: The signature of the school official is required before the student can register for classes

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

INST C051 Becoming a Successful Online Student I Instructor: Debby Kilburn, CRN 73152 (1 unit)

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

BSAD C100 Introduction to Business

FACE C121 Nutrition

CSCI C135 Beginning Adobe Acrobat

Instructor: Tom McGovern, CRN 30139 (1 unit)

This is a hands-on microcomputer course designed to provide basic understanding of Adobe Acrobat©. Topics to be covered include creating portable document files (PDF), working with PDF files, as well as annotation and editing of files. NOTE: Adobe Acrobat 8.0 required for this course. (Mar 17-May 16)

FAMILY AND CONSUMER EDUCATION

FACE C121 Nutrition

Instructor: Greg Kost, CRN 30209 (3 Units)

This course is designed to develop an understanding of the principles of human nutrition, including historical development, underlying physical, mental and emotional health, current world nutrition problems, nutrients and their utilization by the body, and nutritional needs throughout the life cycle. Recent developments in nutrition, food fads and fallacies, and informational nutritional resources will be addressed.

HEALTH CAREERS

HCRS C199 Introduction to Health Care

Instructor: Cheryl Gates, CRN 33246 (3 Units)

This course is designed as an introduction for students entering a variety of health care programs or has an interest in pursuing a career in health care. This course covers the fundamentals common to all health care occupations. Topics included are appropriate for occupations that involve direct patient care, such as nursing and dental assisting, as well as those that provide support services, such as health information technology and pharmacy technician. (Not available at Burroughs High School)

HCRS C150 Medical Terminology for Health Professional Instructor: Cheryl Gates, CRN 30229 (3 Units)

This course is designed to familiarize the student with the language of medicine. The components of medical terminology are highly beneficial for any individual with a health care employment objective. The course presents the components of medical works including

e components of medical works including word roots, combining forms, suffixes, and prefixes. Using medical terminology as a focal point, the systems of the body are discussed.

HCRS C160 Rehabilitative Career Choices

Instructor: Lauren Gates, CRN 30230 (3 units)

This course is designed for individuals interested in various allied health occupations in the field of rehabilitative careers. The student will explore basic concepts involved in the study of basic rehabilitative career opportunities. This course will cover scientific principles and medical terminology, systems of health and healing, chiropractic assisting, massage therapy, physical therapy, sports medicine assisting, personal fitness training and administrative and job seeking skills for the physical medicine worker.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

PDEV C075 Career Alternatives

Instructor: Greg Kost, CRN 30635 (1 unit)

Students will evaluate their individual life-style preferences through use of class assessment tools. Students will explore the world of work and educational programs and have an opportunity to develop career decisions and action plans necessary to achieve individual career goals. (Mar 10-May 8)

MEDIA ARTS

MA C101 Fundamentals of Web Design

Instructor: Suzie Ama, CRN 30635 (3 units)

This course introduces students to principles of web design. Students will acquire skills for creating attractive web pages that are easy to read and navigate and will learn to use a leading web development software application. No prior knowledge of HTML coding is required. Note: Dreamweaver CS3 required for this course.

MA C102 Digital Imaging

Instructor: Cori Ratliff, CRN 30293 (3 units)

This course provides beginning through intermediate concepts in digital imaging. Concepts covered include photo retouching and enhancing, original creation of composite images from photographs and artwork, drawing and painting original digital artwork, and the creation of web graphics. Students will incorporate basic design principles in their digital photographs and compositions. Note: Photoshop CS3 required for this course.

Concurrent Enrollment in College

Concurrent enrollment in college courses by high school students is a privilege provided by Cerro Coso Community College. This process applies to ALL students who are under the age of 18 and have not graduated from high school or completed high school equivalency. In order for a student to be placed in course work in a quick and effective manner, it is important to follow the process outlined below.

Please read the following information carefully:

1. Submit College Application

- New students: Apply online at www.cerrocoso.edu/myBanWeb
- Continuing students: Fill out an Update form at www.cerrocoso.edu/myBanWeb
- Applications/Updates also available at the Admissions and Records Office

2. Complete Concurrent Enrollment Form

Counselors (at all schools) have the concurrent enrollment forms for students and parents.

- A. Student/Parent Section: Parent and student must complete all of the information requested on the Student/Parent section of the Concurrent Enrollment Form. The parent or guardian must sign this form if the student is under the age of 18 years old and BEFORE the student will be allowed to register for courses. NOTE: if the college class is to be used for HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT, be sure the student signs on the line provided.
- B. School Official Section: Student meets with a high school counselor to review student record. If high school record indicates the desired course work is appropriate, high school counselor completes and signs the School Official Section.
- 1. Number of School Credits: The student must have earned enough credits to qualify for freshman class standing or qualify for the Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) Program. GATE verification forms can be obtained at the School

District Office and must be submitted with the Concurrent Enrollment Form.

> 2. Grade Point Average: If a student wishes to enroll in a college class he or she must have achieved a cumulative GPA of 2.75.

- 3. Credit: One of these boxes must be checked. The school official must indicate whether the course will be taken for high school credit, college credit, or both.
- 4. Course Name: The complete title and number of the course should be entered here. Also indicate whether each course is to be taken for college or high school credit.
- 5. Initials of School Official: Please individually initial each course being approved. The Cerro Coso counselor will consider only courses initialed.
- 6. Release Approval: The signature of the school official is required before the student can register for classes

BSAD C072 Introduction to Accounting

30072 Jan 19-May 15 ONL O'Connor K (A 3 Units)

This course covers basic accounting concepts and procedures required to complete an accounting cycle. Account types, (assets, liabilities, equity, revenue, expenses) as well as procedures for bank reconciliation, petty cash, and payroll are introduced. Learners complete business transactions from day-to-day recordkeeping to closing entries and preparation of year end documents balance sheet, income statement, and statement of owner's equity for a sample merchandising business. Advisory: BSAD C070.

BSOT C131 Basic Computer Keyboarding

30094 Jan 19-May 15 ONL O'Connor K (A/CSU 1 Unit)

Learners are introduced to a microcomputer keyboard with an emphasis on learning and skill-building correct touch typing techniques for alphanumeric, symbol, and punctuation keys. Advisory: Level 2 Reading.

BSOT C132 Intermediate Computer Keyboarding 30096 Jan 19-May 15 ONL O'Connor K (A/CSU 1 Unit)

Learners in this course build on a basic keyboarding foundation with correct touch typing techniques, including alphabetic, numeric, and symbol keyboarding as well as 10-Key numeric keypad. Skill building includes introductory formatting of documents. Successful completion of this class will result in minimum keyboarding speed of 30 wpm net. Advisory: BSOT C131 or 15 wpm net on a two minute supervised timing.

CSCI C070 Computer Literacy

30134 Jan 19-Mar 13 ONL Warnock R (A 1 Unit)

This hands-on course is designed for those with little or no computer experience. Learners practice file management, email, instant messaging and basic word processing as well as Internet browsing and searching. Computer terminology and identification of fundamental hardware and software applications is introduced. This course brings the successful participant to universal computer literacy standards for the International Computer Drivers License (ICDL). Advisory: Level 2 Reading.

CSCI C101 Introduction to Computer Information Systems 33201 Jan 19-May 15 ONL Kurti D (A/UC/CSU 3 Units)

This survey class introduces the learner to uses of computers in business and society through exploration of hardware, software, file management, networks, digital media, the Internet, web page creation and business software. Context and issues related to the computer industry as well as information systems and design are presented. Group projects include writing and presenting on a relevant topic utilizing business software and research skills developed in class. Advisory: CSCI C070, Level 2 Reading, Level 2 Writing.

CSCI C121 Beginning Word

30139 Jan 19-Mar 13 ONL Sellers A (A/CSU 1 Unit) 30138 Mar 16-May 15 ONL Sellers A (A/CSU 1 Unit)

This hands-on computer course is designed to provide basic understanding of word processing concepts using Microsoft Word. Learners create, edit, and format documents including business letters, multiple-page reports, newsletters, and cover letters. This course begins preparation for the core level Microsoft Office Specialist certification exam for Microsoft Word. Advisory: CSCI C070 or CSCI C101 or equivalent.

CSCI C127 MS PowerPoint

30145 Jan 19-Mar 13 ONL Bultman K (A/CSU 1 Unit)

This is a hands-on microcomputer course designed to provide basic understanding of Microsoft PowerPoint. Topics to be covered include planning, creating, editing, viewing, and printing. This course prepares the student to take the core level Microsoft PowerPoint Office Users Specialist certification exam. Advisory: CSCI C070 or CSCI C101 or equivalent.

CSCI C140 A+ Essential Skills for Computers

30148 Jan 19-May 15 ONL Harper/Johnson (A/CSU 2 Units)

This course emphasizes a fundamental technical understanding of personal computer hardware, setup, maintenance, and installation in a personal workgroup environment. This course prepares a student for the CompTIA A+ essentials exam for entry level IT Technicians and services as a building block for further certification oriented technical training. Advisory: CSCI C101

CSCI C141 A+ Standard Skills for IT Technicians

30149 Jan 19-May 15 ONL Harper/Johnson (A/CSU 2 Units)

This course builds upon the technical understanding of professional computer support and develops competency for troubleshooting in a corporate network environment. This course prepares a student for the CompTIA A+ 220-602 exam for IT Technicians. Advisory: CSCI C140.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

CHDV C115 Child, Family and Community 30558 Feb 9-May 8 ONL Fuller E (A/CSU 3 Units)

This course examines patterns of family systems in contemporary society as they are infl uenced by heritage, diverse cultures, abilities, and languages. The value of communication, the development of child advocacy skills, and the ability to use community resources to empower families and children are explored. Advisory: Level 1 Reading, Level 1 Writing.

COUNSELING

PDEV C052 Becoming A Successful Online Student 30381 Jan 19-Feb 6 ONL Hamilton K (A 1 Unit)

This course covers the basics of taking an interactive, asynchronous, distance education course via the Internet or other computer based system. Students gain a sense of self-awareness about their personal learning style and develop self-motivation skills. Use of e-mail, discussion groups, World Wide Web access, equipment needs, and differences between on-line and onsite courses are covered. Advisory: Computer Competency.

PDEV C075 Career Alternatives

30386 Mar 16-May 15 ONL Adams W (A 1 Unit)

DIGITAL MEDIA ARTS

DMA C111 XHTML and CSS

Fees for Virtual High School

Cerro Coso enrollment fees of \$36/unit are waived for K-12 students. Nonresident tuition <u>will</u> apply if the K-12 student is an international student **or** is not a California resident **or** has not lived in California for one year and one day prior to enrolling at Cerro Coso.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

Responsibility: By enrolling in a college level course, you are agreeing that YOU will be responsible for communicating with your instructors, studying at least two hours for every hour of class (minimum), turning in college level assignments complete and on time, and purchasing all textbooks within the first week of class. If you are uncertain about carrying out any of these responsibilities, a college course may not be the best option for you at this time.

<u>Hamework</u>: Although you have a class period set aside on your high school campus each day to work on your Virtual High School class, you will be required to complete homework and other coursework at home. Therefore you will need to have access to a computer with internet. A good rule to follow for determining how much homework you will have is: for every unit you are enrolled in you will have 2-3 hours of homework each week. Therefore if you enrolled in a 3 unit class, you will have between 6-9 hours of homework each week for that class.

<u>Text Books</u>: As with any college course textbooks are a requirement. You may purchase your textbook through the Cerro Coso Book Store.

<u>Wait listing</u>: Virtual High School students are not eligible to be registered for classes until two weeks after the first day of open registration. Therefore if the course you want to take becomes full before you are registered for it you will have to select a new course. High school students cannot be "Waitlisted" for Cerro Coso classes.

Cerro Coso Email Account: You are assigned a Cerro Coso email account. Your professor will ONLY send emails to your Cerro Coso email account, please check this email regularly for updates and class info.
