# Item 1. Statement of Program Goals and Objectives

The goal of the Associate in Arts in Anthropology for Transfer Degree is to provide an advanced understanding of the discipline and to prepare students for transfer to any CSU for a baccalaureate degree in Anthropology.

#### **Program Learning Outcomes**

Upon successful completion of the program, the student will be able to

- 1. Critique selected aspects of human social and cultural life from an anthropological perspective.
- 2. Compare and contrast major theoretical perspectives in anthropology.
- 3. Use the scientific method to analyze aspects of the human condition.
- 4. Analyze the place of humanity in nature and describe the methods used to study humans as biological organisms.
- 5. Identify major trends in cultural evolution using the material cultures of prehistoric and historic humans.

# Item 2. Catalog Description

## Associate in Arts in Anthropology for Transfer Degree (AA-T)

An Associate in Arts in Anthropology for Transfer Degree prepares students for transfer to the CSU system to earn a baccalaureate in Anthropology and its subfields, Archaeology, Biological Anthropology, Cultural Anthropology, and Linguistic Anthropology. Anthropology teaches students to think critically about humans worldwide, their biology, and their culture. Upon successful completion of the program students will be able to apply anthropological principles to the understanding of human cultural and biological variation, compare and contrast major theoretical perspectives in anthropology, and evaluate cross-cultural data using the scientific method. These skills can be applied to a baccalaureate degree in anthropology, forensics, law, business, cultural resource management, and human services.

To complete the degree, students must fulfill both of the following requirements:

- A. Completion of 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
  - a. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education-Breadth Requirements.
  - b. Minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the Kern Community College District Board of Trustees.
- B. Attainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
- *C.* Completion in all courses for the major or area of emphasis must be a "C" or better. *A* "P" (Pass) grade is not an acceptable grade for courses in the major.

Please note that our local Cerro Coso general education pattern MAY NOT be used to fulfill the requirements of this degree and that all required courses for the degree must be transferable to CSU.
