### 2. Main Session (Agenda Items)

#### a. Old business

- i. **March in March-** March of March field trip event was cancelled February, 26<sup>th</sup> due to the lack of student participation. March in March is a yearly recognition of California Colleges by students of the California college system. Issues of policy and funding are discussed and presented by student to the state level. This year's event was to take place in Sacramento, California; March 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> (Sunday and Monday).
- ii. **Student Elections-** Student elections will be held at the beginning of April. Student campaigns will be held in the month of March. Students who are interested in Student Government are encouraged to run for open positions or sign-up and participate on campus committees. Information for available student government positions and committees and their responsibilities can be obtained in the Student Activities office located in the Student Center.
- iii. **Region IX Representative-** Legislative positions and Student Senate (SSCCC) representation fees will be discussed. (Traian Morris will have appropriated floor time for anticipated positions that may require a vote from the Student Government).
- iv. **Affordable Food Assess for Students-** The Elected-board is investigating a purposed non-profit food pantry, which will co-exist with Access Program (Special Services). This purposed pantry station would have available snacks at no profit to students. This food station would not compete with the Coyote Café, but would be an alternative for financially challenged students to purchase economical snacks. The recycling of campus cans and bottles was a suggested primary source for revenue for the purchase of food items; but after investigation the authorizations of generated income from recycling does not fall into the Student Government jurisdiction. A purposed vote for an allocation of \$300.00 to \$500.00 of student funding per year will be introduced to the Student Government for consideration.

#### b. New Business

- i. **Introduction of New Senator-** The E-board would like welcome Bonnie Moir. Moir will be taking part as one of Cerro Coso Community Colleges Senator's; (Allotted floor time for introduction of new Senator Bonnie Moir).
- ii. **Political Science Club-** Angelo Sanchez would like to inform the Student Government of the status of Cerro Coso's PlySci Club.



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- iii. **Glee Club-** The creation of a Cerro Coso's Glee Club is in development. Faculty supervisor will be Mary Peoples. Additional information will be conveyed to the Student Government when it becomes available.
- iv. **Chemistry Club-** The creation of a Cerro Coso's Chemistry Club is in development. Additional information will be conveyed to the Student Government when it becomes available.
- v. **English Classics Club-** The creation of a Cerro Coso's English Classics Club is in development. Additional information will be conveyed to the Student Government when it becomes available.
- vi. **March Speaker Event, Leslie Stein-** Cerro Coso will have an invited speaker on March, 14<sup>th</sup> (Thursday). Leslie Stein has been invited to speak to Cerro Coso students and the outlining community. Stein describes herself as a "Life Enthusiast," because if there is some kind of challenge most people don't want to tackle...she'll give it a try. An inspirational speaker and professional life coach, she has worked with such notable organizations as: Disney; Proctor & Gamble; The United Way; The U.S. Food and Drug Administration; American Speech-Language Hearing Association (ASHA); and countless others. Stein will share her views on a successful life and lecture about her book, *Penny Perspectives: Let Go of Happily Ever After & Invest in Happily Ever Now*. Lecture will begin at 6:00pm in the Student Center.
- vii. **March Video Game Tournament and Fundraiser-** March movie night will be replaced with a video game fund raising tournament, which will be conducted in the Student Center at Cerro Coso. This event is open to all students and the outlining community. Please refer to advertisement for times and particulars. (Floor time given to organizers).
- viii. **Cerro Coso Open House-** Cerro Coso College will have an Open House on April, 6<sup>th</sup> (Saturday). Potential students and the outlying community are invited to preview the campus. Clubs will be invited to participate in this event. The Student Government has purposed the ideas of a barbeque and meet and greet, as activities for the student government at this event.
- ix. **Earth Day Event-** Cerro Coso will be conducting its annual Earth Day event on April, 23<sup>rd</sup> (Tuesday). All clubs are invited to participate in this year's event. Students and the Local community will be invited to partake in activities and speak with vendors that promote ecological and environmental practices.
