Hi All!As everyone's working hard to get their plans ready for Fall semester more than a few people have been asking for ways to engage students in your work. If you're looking for ways to introduce your student government to textbook affordability and open textbooks, we have a free training opportunity for student government leaders that will help set them up to advocate on these issues. We're launching a new free webinar series for student government leaders through the Student Government Resource Center, which is a project of the Student PIRGs.

The three part training will focus on college affordability with information on textbook and course material affordability. There are three trainings: Affordable Higher Ed Landscape Briefing: a broader look at places where student governments can make an impact at a campus, local, or federal levelPlanning impactful campaigns: I'll be using an affordable textbooks campaign to illustrate the principles of goal setting, strategy, and visibilityStrategy Feedback Workshop: This will build off the second training and give student leaders a chance to "Shark tank" a campaign plan with a full time organizing director and receive feedback.
