



2021-2022 Accomplishments









- New certificate program in Entrepreneurship. With just four classes, students develop an entrepreneurial mindset to launch their business ideas.
- ISEP student David Zemp ranked 3rd place, out of 177 submissions, in the USC Underground Writing project with his essay on Open Doors.
- Private and Proprietary Security Academy held for the first time. Designed for students pursuing employment as registered security guards or private security officers.



- CCCC Founding President, Dr. Richard Jones, returned to the Ridgecrest campus to tour the facilities for the first time in almost 50 years.
- New Addiction Studies program began in the fall of 2022 for those interested in the growing field of drug and alcohol dependency treatment, prevention, and education.

Cerro Coso Men's Baseball Team finished 2nd in the IEAC Conference playoffs, with 24 wins and 17 losses. They ended the year on a high note with 9 sophomores, 6 of them signed with 4-year baseball scholarships, and 2 signed to play professional baseball (Johnny McHenry and Danny Jimenez). Go Coyotes!



- Men's Basketball team makes it into CCCAA post-season playoffs for the first time in 23 years under the leadership of Coach Dugan.
- New AA-T degree in Law, Public Policy and Society.
- Promise students assist in set-up of new Salvation Army Store. New corps officers Lts. Chris and Gina Noble's first task was to completely refurbish the Salvation Army Family Store and Donation Center and Cerro Coso Promise students helped to set up the newly remodeled center.

- Construction of a new
 Maintenance and Operations
 building was completed in
 2022. The team of men and
 women who provide valuable
 services required to maintain
 and operate all campus
 facilities were housed in a
 modular unit older than the
 campus itself.
- Or CCCC ranks #19 for Best Online Degree Program.
 University Headquarters
 (UHQ), a top site for college ranks and student resources ranked Cerro Coso #19 for the Best Community College for an Online Degree in California. The site uses a proprietary rating system to evaluate the nation's top universities and colleges both public and private.
- CCCC named 2022 Champion for Excelling in Equitable Course Placement in Black English Enrollment and Black Math Throughput by the Campaign for College Opportunity.
- Beta Kappa Chi Chapter of PTK recognized for bringing life-changing benefits and opportunities of PTK membership to even more students on its campuses. The CCCC Foundation offers \$10,000 in local student support for PTK memberships every year.

Cheers for Charity donates \$6,000 of its proceeds to the Promise Program in support of Promise scholarships.
They raised \$55,000 in support of local charities during their Wine, Craft Beer, and Food event held in August. Cheers for Charity is committed to helping nonprofits in the Tehachapi area.



- Wine and Food Pairing **Fundraiser first CCCC** Foundation in-person fundraiser to be held in two years due to the pandemic. The event held at Mac's International Cuisine featured wine and food pairing with wine expert Eric Le Barbé from France. A sensory experience that included a four-course gourmet meal with Mac's Owner and Chef Kent McGowan, and a series of discussions and exercises.
- United Way (UW) of the IWV donates \$10,000 to Coyote Cupboard to help fight student food insecurities.









Record Breaking 955 Degrees and Certificates Awarded

Early College Program Allows 17 to Graduate College Before High School


High School students across Cerro Coso's service area are enrolling in college credit classes and finding that graduating from college before graduating from high school is a very real possibility.

Seventeen high school students graduated with Associate Degrees from Cerro Coso in May, within weeks of graduating from their respective high school. All the result of partnerships with service area high schools and the college dual and concurrent enrollment programs. These students are way ahead of the curve. Earning their associate degrees will save these students' tuition at a four-year university.

The Kern Community College District has one of the state's most dually enrolled high school students in fall 2021, making it the second in size only to the Los Angeles Community College District.

CC Online Celebrates 25th Anniversary

Cerro Coso began offering distance education courses online in 1997 as an alternative to the traditional classroom. CC Online is a virtual campus at Cerro Coso Community College. The campus provides students the opportunity to take courses from a distance. Through the Internet and Canvas, students can interact with faculty in a virtual classroom setting, allowing for flexibility



and convenience in the students' schedules. The success of Cerro Coso's Online courses uniquely positioned the college to move on-ground classes to remote delivery quickly in response to the pandemic of 2020-2022.

The CCCC Foundation held its first Promise Stole Ceremony in May. Thirty-four graduates in the Promise Program received special blue and white stoles representing their commitment and determination to fulfill the requirements of a CCCC Promise student.

The **Cerro Coso Promise** is a scholarship intended for hard-working, dedicated students that deserve an education, regardless of income. By meeting basic criteria, students may qualify for up to \$1,000 per semester for 2 years to help with tuition, books, and fees.

However, educational programs and services have been present in Ridgecrest, where the Indian Wells Valley campus is presently located, since 1951. Cerro Coso provides educational services to a population of about 85,000 distributed over a service area of over 18,000 square miles – the largest community college service area in California. Such a large area requires multiple physical sites to provide quality learning. Cerro Coso Community College offers instructional and student support services to approximately 7,800 students at six campus locations and through distance education.
