According to the ASCCC OERI website, the following colleges - College of the Canyons, Madera, Moorpark, Saddleback, Santa Monica, Reedley, West Hills – Lemoore have already established a ZTC pathway for the Early Childhood Education program. Additionally, Butte and Saddleback have a ZTC pathway for its Child and Adolescent Development program. After reviewing the CVC website, we found no evidence that these colleges offer any online Child Development programs. Our objective with this grant is to create four fully online ZTC certificate programs: Child Development Associate Teacher, Child Development Master Teacher, Child Development Site Supervisor, and Child Development Teacher. What further sets our programs apart is our plan to use the grant funding to develop a fully online POCR-certified and ADA-compliant pathway.

13. How will the college prioritize using existing OER content in your ZTC program pathway to avoid creating additional, duplicate OER content? *

With the ZTC Implementation grant funds, our college plans to offer four online Child Development ZTC pathway certificate programs: Child Development Associate Teacher Certificate of Achievement, Child Development Master Teacher Certificate of Achievement, Child Development Teacher Certificate of Achievement, Child Development Teacher Certificate of Achievement. Students completing CHDV C203 Practicum: Field Experience will complete their field experience in person in an approved early childhood program in their community. Our strategy to reduce redundant materials creation involves fostering collaboration amongst faculty members from the Child Development department and librarians. The college librarians have already developed an action plan for assisting in this work (whether we get the grant or not), including ensuring the college's currently-adopted OERs are properly licensed, providing training and consultation with faculty on OERs and Zero Cost options, creating course LibGuides and Course Packs with library eBooks and articles as options, and expanding the college's online text reserve to include multiple digital copies of textbooks for which there are no OER or eBook versions.

Furthermore, a key strategy in achieving this goal involves the development of a dedicated ZTC repository hosted within Canvas Learning Tools Interoperability (LTI). This repository will seamlessly integrate with Canvas courses across the college, making existing OER materials curated through the ZTC Implementation and Acceleration grants process for any of our ZTC program pathways accessible within any of our college Canvas courses. Faculty members will have the convenience of directly searching for existing OER materials directly within their Canvas course interfaces. Additionally, we are committed to ensuring that all materials included in this repository are ADA-compliant to identify and integrate accessible OER resources into their courses.

14. Describe the college's plan for sustainability of this ZTC program pathway after the grant funding is exhausted. Include how ZTC content will continue to be updated and available to students. *

Once the ZTC Acceleration grant funding is exhausted, the college's strategy for maintaining the Child Development ZTC certificate program pathways will involve the use of OERs, digitized reserves from the library, and other freely available online resources to ensure ongoing student access to ZTC content. Additionally, the Child Development Department will leverage Strong Workforce funding to procure materials relevant to the ECE/CHDV field, ensuring continued access to pertinent resources without incurring additional expenses.

15. Does the college have a multi-member team working on zero textbook cost program pathway development? *

The project team will include faculty members responsible for teaching course sections within the ZTC program pathway, the Vice President of Academic Affairs, the Dean of Career and Technical Education (CTE), Child Development department chair, our college's POCR faculty reviewers, accessibility experts, a Canvas LTI developer, the Director of Distance Education, librarians, and the program coordinator. Each member brings unique expertise and perspectives to ensure the successful design, implementation, and continuation of the Child Development ZTC certificate program pathways. Their collaborative efforts encompass scheduling for the ZTC program pathway, selection of OER resources, development of the ZTC repository Canvas LTI, compliance with accessibility standards, and quality review of the program through the POCR certification process.

16. Is the college collaborating with other colleges within the local college district? *

Yes – The three Academic Senates from Bakersfield College, Porterville College and Cerro Coso Community College collaborate by jointly reviewing and shaping academic policies and by sharing resources that improve the educational experience of the students.
