

Summary of Findings

Professional Development Survey Spring 2023

Focus: Faculty

The Professional Development Committee distributed a survey regarding Professional Development at Cerro Coso in Spring 2023 to all staff. This report will focus on the findings for employees identifying as "Full Time Faculty" or "Adjunct Faculty". 38 faculty members responded to the survey, 21 full time and 17 adjunct faculty.

The survey consisted of 5 basic parts:


- 1. Perception on professional development at Cerro Coso
 - Offerings
 - Communication
- 2. Professional development preferences
 - learning modalities
 - preferred times for professional development 0
- 3. Factors impacting participation in professional development
- Prioritization of professional development topics 4.

In general, faculty prefer online synchronous professional development prior to the start of the semester. Their biggest barriers to participating in professional development appear to be related to scheduling and their availability to participate and interest in the topics offered. Overall, Faculty are most interested in topics related to Student Success and Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility (DEIA). They also have an interest in Canvas related topics. Currently, full time faculty have a higher interest in DEIA topics while Adjunct faculty have a high interest in topics regarding Safety & Crisis Management.

Perceptions

Question: Overall, how would you rate the professional development offerings at Cerro Coso?


Result: On the survey, respondents gave 1 to 5 stars. Overall, faculty rated professional development offerings **3.78 stars**. The average response by full time faculty was **3.8 stars** and for adjunct faculty was **3.75 stars**.

Question: How would you rate communication about professional development?


Result: On the survey, respondents gave 1 to 5 stars. Overall, faculty rated communication about professional development **3.89 stars**. The average response by full time faculty was **3.9 stars** and for adjunct faculty was **3.88 stars**.

Result: Survey respondents arranged responses from "most preferred" at the top and "least preferred" at the bottom. Overall, faculty Most Prefer **Online Synchronous** learning. While this doesn't change for full-time faculty, for adjunct faculty, they also are open to live and in-person or other asynchronous options.





Results: For each of the provided times, survey respondents indicated "Very likely," "Somewhat likely," or "Unlikely" to attend. Overall, faculty members are very likely to attend prior to the start of the academic semester. They also are somewhat likely to attend professional development during the fall and/or spring semesters.




Factors

Results: For each of the provided factors, survey respondents indicated "High Impact," "Moderate Impact," "Low Impact," or "No Impact or No Opinion". The biggest factors to impact faculty are **interest in the topics offered** and **scheduling/availability to participate in activities**. They also appreciate having information about professional development opportunities, particularly for adjunct faculty.
