Dr. Sunny Cooke currently serves as Associate Vice Chancellor for Workforce Development in the North Harris Montgomery Community College District (NHMCCD) located in suburban Houston, Texas. In this role, she has had the opportunity to lay a foundation for data-driven decision making, research and planning to identify, expand and fund the workforce development offerings within the five college district. The district currently serves some 45,000 credit students and an additional 15,000 continuing education students.



Dr. Cooke has worked at Montgomery College (one of the five NHMCCD colleges) since 1995 following her postdoctoral training at MD Anderson Cancer Center where she explored the role that cell recognition and adhesion play in cancer cell metastasis. Most recently she successfully spearheaded an effort to obtain a \$1.6 million grant from the Texas Workforce Commission to support 12 local businesses with skill upgrades for 850 employees within the manufacturing industry and to create 650 new jobs within the area.

Her service has benefited local schools, career academies, chambers, professional societies, leadership academies and the Global Corporate College. She was recently named to serve a three year term on the International Chair Academy's Practitioner's Board. Over the years, she has served as a mentor to emerging higher education leaders, taught in community development institutes and graduate programs as well as served on the professional development organization within her college.
